he late Mrs. Nancy Osei-Boadi, also known as Abrewa Saara, Maame Saara, and Ama Saara, was born on Saturday, September 12, 1955, in Tarkwa Brenuakyim to the late

Obaapanyin Yaa Ampomoah of the Royal Oyoko Ebusua of Himan and the late Opanyin William Kobina Dadson of the Royal Anona Ebusua of Asaafa, both of blessed memory.

Nancy began her elementary education at Tarkwa Urban Council Experimental School, now known as Hooper Memorial School, from 1961 to 1971. After completing her studies, she moved to Takoradi to live with her late elder sister, Jane, who worked as a hairdresser. She stayed with her sister from 1972 to 1974 before returning to Tarkwa to start a life of her own.

In a stroke of good fortune, she was employed as a receptionist at Golden Home Hotel, a well-known hotel in Tarkwa. During her journey, she met her loving husband, Mr. Mark Osei-Boadi, who was employed as Chief Internal Auditor with the then State Gold Mining Corporation, now Goldfields

Ghana Limited. As a young and beautiful lady, Nancy captured his heart, and they were married, with the ceremony being officiated by the late Opanyin John Kweku Sekum Mensah, of blessed memory. Together, they were blessed with six wonderful children.

Ama Saara worked tirelessly alongside her husband to support the upbringing of their children. As a faithful and loving wife and mother, she was cherished by everyone in the family. Her care and compassion knew no bounds. She went the extra mile to ensure she had strong relationships with both her immediate and extended family. With the help of her hardworking husband, she also adopted and raised many of her nephews, nieces, and even some of her grandchildren until her passing.

Nancy was not only loved by her family but also adored by those outside of it.

The late Ama Saara and her husband relocated to Takoradi after Mr. Osei-Boadi was employed by Ghana Prime Wood Product Company Limited. True to her industrious nature, she could not stay idle. She began poultry farming at home, which started small but soon grew into a large business, supplying poultry products to numerous companies and hotels in Takoradi. After several years, she transitioned into wholesale biscuit trading through her association with Mr. & Mrs. Adulley (P.K).

A devoted Christian from a Methodist background,
Nancy later joined the Fountain of Grace International
Church and eventually became a member of the
Faithway Outreach Ministry International. Her
commitment to church activities earned her the name
"Church Mother."

Aunty Nancy was a philanthropist, a unifier, a mother, a disciplinarian, an organizer, and a selfless leader who welcomed everyone into her fold.

She will forever be remembered as a woman who was bold, fair, and firm in her decisions. The Oyoko Ebusua has lost a true gem—she was a constant source of inspiration to us all.

On December 16, 2024, she suddenly fell ill and passed away on December 19, 2024, at exactly 4 a.m. She fought a good fight, and now the victory crown awaits her. Obaapanyin Saara, we are deeply grateful for your life and proud to have been part of it.


